

Michael Schadler Joins the Florida Tomato Committee

Michael Schadler joined the Florida Tomato Committee on February 1st as its Deputy Manager, and will also act as the Sr. Vice President of the Florida Tomato Exchange and the Florida Tomato Growers Exchange. Schadler was hired to succeed the Committee's longtime Manager, Reggie Brown, who plans to retire in early 2018. Until that time, Schadler will work under Brown to learn the dynamics of the Committee and Exchanges. Upon his hiring, Schadler noted:
